## SENATE MEETING SUMMARY April 6, 2017

- Special Order: Presidential Briefing
  - President Loh took questions from Senators on a variety of topics including the future of the Purple Line, the state legislative session, student groups at the University, and the importance of voting.
- Senate Chair's Report
  - The Senate Chair spoke about the importance of federal research funding to the University. He encouraged Senators to attend the <u>March for Science</u> in Washington, DC on April 22nd and the <u>Celebration of American Science & Engineering (CASE)</u> on campus on April 21st.
