

GUIDELINES FOR PLAN OF ORGANIZATION REVIEW COMMITTEE (PORC)

- 6.3 Review of the current Plan of Organization shall be undertaken at least every ten years by a committee composed of members elected by the Senate. The Senate Executive Committee may institute a review of the Plan by such a committee in the fifth or subsequent year following a review if in its judgment there have been changes in the University significant enough to justify a review.
- 6.3.a The committee shall be sponsored by the Senate but no more than seven current members of the Senate shall be elected to the committee.
- 6.3.b Each College or School, and the Library, shall have at least one representative faculty member on the committee. In addition there shall be at least two University-wide administrators, two undergraduate students, two graduate students, and two staff members.
- 6.3.c The committee shall elect its own presiding officer.
- 6.3.d Members of the committee shall serve until their report has been accepted or rejected by the Executive Committee of the Senate.

MEMBERSHIP OF PORC

1. One faculty representative from each college, school and the Library
2. Two administrators
3. Two undergraduate students
4. Two staff members

Questions for Consideration Regarding Membership Guidelines:

1. Should the SEC include more than one nominee for each criterion?
2. Should the SEC have separate slots for non-exempt and exempt staff so that one of each is selected for the committee?
3. Should the SEC include representatives from the NTT Faculty as a college faculty representative? If so, should there be representatives from the research and instructional NTT faculty?
4. Should students be representative of both "sides" of campus (i.e. humanities and sciences)?
5. Should the committee be larger than the minimum required 21 members?
