Notes from the March Senate Meeting

↑ t the March 8, 2012 Senate **L**meeting the Senate voted in favor of changing the name of the PhD in Public and Community Health to the **PhD** in **Behavioral** and Community Health. The name change was intended to better titles. These titles would apply to convey the nature of the work conducted within the program and to more accurately reflect the focus on health behavior. In addition, the Senate voted in favor of a new policy on the employment of Adjunct Faculty; this policy would be a campus level version of the recently created **University** System of Maryland policy on

Adjunct Faculty. The Senate also voted in favor of an update to the University Policy on Appointment, Promotion, and Tenure of Faculty that would activate the Clinical Faculty faculty engaged exclusively or primarily in clinical teaching. Lastly, the Senate Bylaws were recently revised by the Senate Elections, Representation, and Governance (ERG) Committee with a number of title updates. The Senate voted in favor of all the suggested title changes in the Senate Bylaws.



Serving on the Senate provides an opportunity to have greater awareness about issues going on at the campus level. Senators can then serve as a bridge between that level and our local departments, as we engage in the shared governance process.

The March University Senate meeting featured our continued attention to policies on non-tenure track and adjunct faculty, with particular focus on working conditions and fair compensation. University colleagues can track our work on these crucial issues on the Senate website. Concomitantly, for tenure-track and tenured faculty, the Provost is working with the Senate leadership to study step and

other systems of reward in order to insure more equity and begin to address salary compression, a persistent issue. So the Faculty Affairs Committee has been charged with reviewing these alternative methods of compensation. This is a very important step forward regarding our reward system on this campus, so stay tuned! We continue to work on parental (not simply maternal) leave policies for both faculty and staff.
