Notes from the September Senate Meeting

↑ t the September 2011 Senate Imeeting, Senators reviewed the 2010-2011 Senate Legislation Log (Senate Doc. 11-12-01) and voted to approve the 2011-2012 Standing Committee and Council Slates (**Senate Doc. 11-12-02**). Senators voted in favor of amending Senate endorsed a draft of the the University's smoking policy to extend the 'no smoking' area around buildings from 15 feet to 25 feet (Senate Doc. 08-09-15). Senators also voted to approve an amendment to the recently created Policy for a Student's Medically Necessitated Absence From Class

(Senate Doc. 11-12-07); this linguistic amendment clarifies the policy's requirement that, "For a medically necessitated absence from a single lecture, recitation, or lab, students may submit a self-signed note to their instructor." Lastly, the 2011-2030 Facilities Master Plan. This 123-page document includes an overview of UMD's mission, current and future characteristics, a land and facilities assessment, a plan foundation and framework, major recommendations, and implementation strategies.

he Campus Affairs Committee has completed its report on a campus-wide helmet policy and submitted it to the Senate **Executive Committee (SEC)** for review; the Senate will vote on the recommendations at the October 20, 2011 Senate meeting. Three proposals regarding the University's sexual harassment policy have been submitted to the Senate Office and will be charged to committees for review. APAS will send a final recommendation on weighted plus/minus grading for GPA calculation to the SEC in November. The President of the Student Government Association (SGA) submitted a proposal to clarify and improve the student class selection process; the Educational Affairs Committee will be charged with reviewing this proposal. The **Student Conduct Committee** is creating an online academic integrity tutorial for

students at UMD. The Faculty Affairs Committee will begin its review of policies for Adjunct Faculty in October, while the ERG Committee will continue to review several Plans of Organization. Also, be on the lookout for outreach from the Staff Affairs Committee about nominating outstanding non-exempt and exempt staff members for a Board of Regents' Staff Award!
