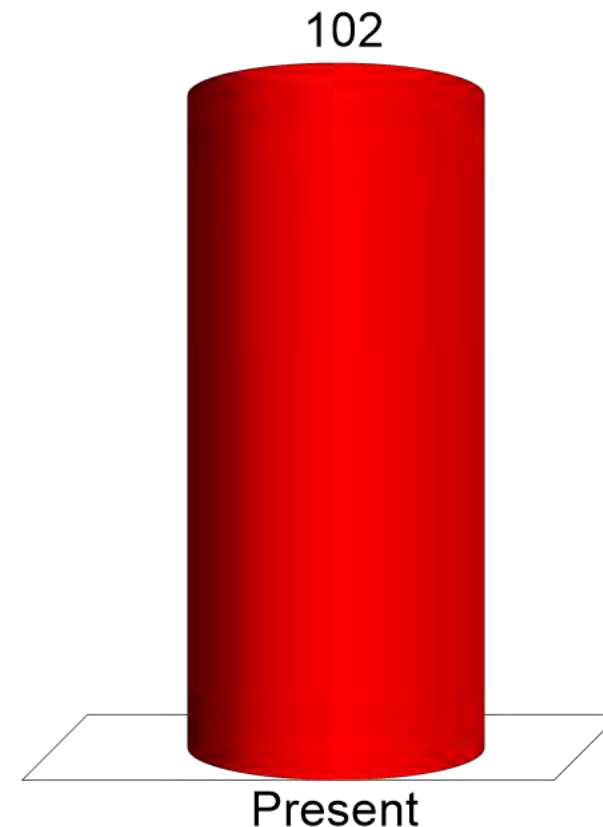

New Senators

Procedures and Guidelines

- We will adhere to Senate procedures for in-person meetings as closely as possible.
- All University policies and expectations for appropriate conduct still apply during this meeting.

- The audio from all Senate meetings is saved and archived, as is our standard practice for all Senate meetings.



Procedures and Guidelines

- While all members of the campus community have been invited to our meeting, only Senators and Deans may vote.
- Senators and Deans may speak and may introduce members of the campus community to speak during discussion of action items.



Meeting Logistics

- We are using the Zoom webinar format for the meeting.
- Senators received a separate email directly from Zoom to join the meeting as a panelist, which allows them to fully participate in the meeting.
- Members of the campus community used the general link to join as Attendees.
- Voting Senators and Deans can make a motion that is in order when someone else has the floor, **such as a point of information to get additional context or a point of personal privilege to report a disruption or distraction (e.g., zoombombing).**



Meeting Logistics

- Senators should use the Chat box in Zoom to make **Points of Order**.
- Simply post “Point of Order” in the Chat box and the Chair will respond.
- We will **NOT** respond to questions, comments, or technical difficulties in the Chat.

- All participants are **muted** with the ability to unmute themselves. You will be asked to unmute yourself when you are recognized to speak.

- Both the Senator and the attendee should use the Raise Hand feature. I will recognize the Senator who can then introduce the attendee and I will recognize them.



Voting

- Senators must use PointSolutions to vote during the Action items on our agenda.
- Use the PointSolutions mobile app or go to <https://ttpoll.com> on a web browser and login to PointSolutions with your University email address and your CAS directory ID and password.
- You will then be asked for a Session ID. Today's Session ID is **welcome23**. Click Join Session after entering the Session ID.
- Please note that the Session ID will change for each Senate meeting so that only Senators who are in attendance at the meeting can vote.

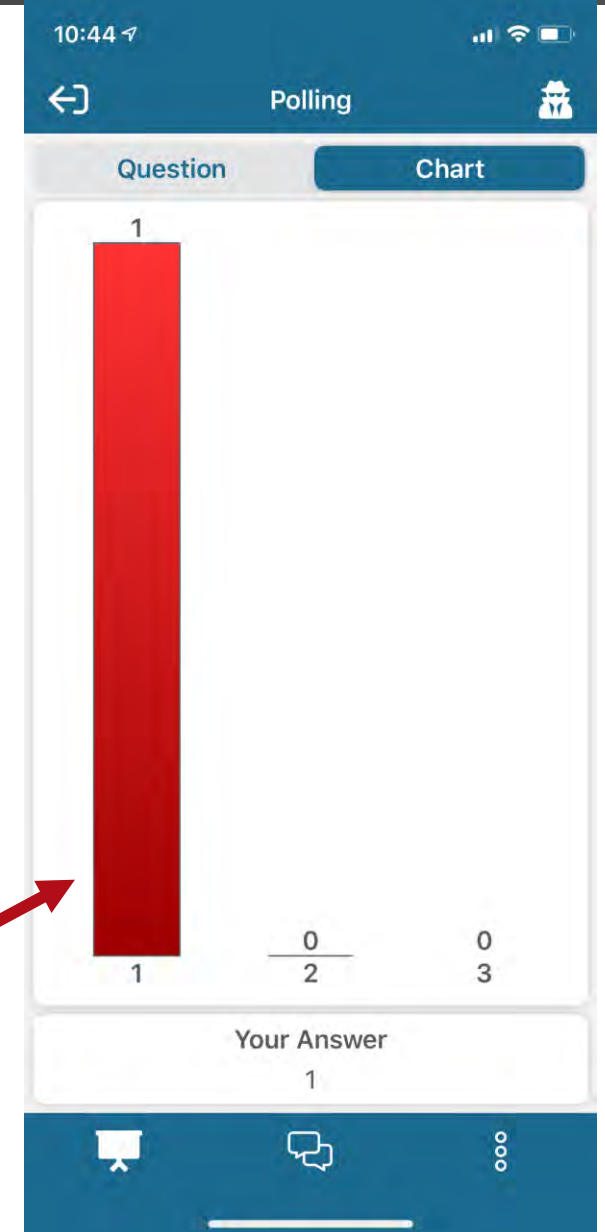


Voting

- The Session ID will always be listed on the Quorum slide at the start of the meeting, and will also be included at the top of all of the meeting slides in **red bold font** for any Senators who arrive late.
- Senators and Deans will use their mobile device or a web browser to vote by pressing/clicking on the circled numbers at the bottom (1-in favor; 2-opposed; and 3-abstain) and the results will display on the screen.



When we open the voting, you will see the item that we are voting on and the options on your screen. You can then press or click on the circled numbers corresponding with your choice on the bottom of your screen. After the voting is complete, the results will display on your screen.

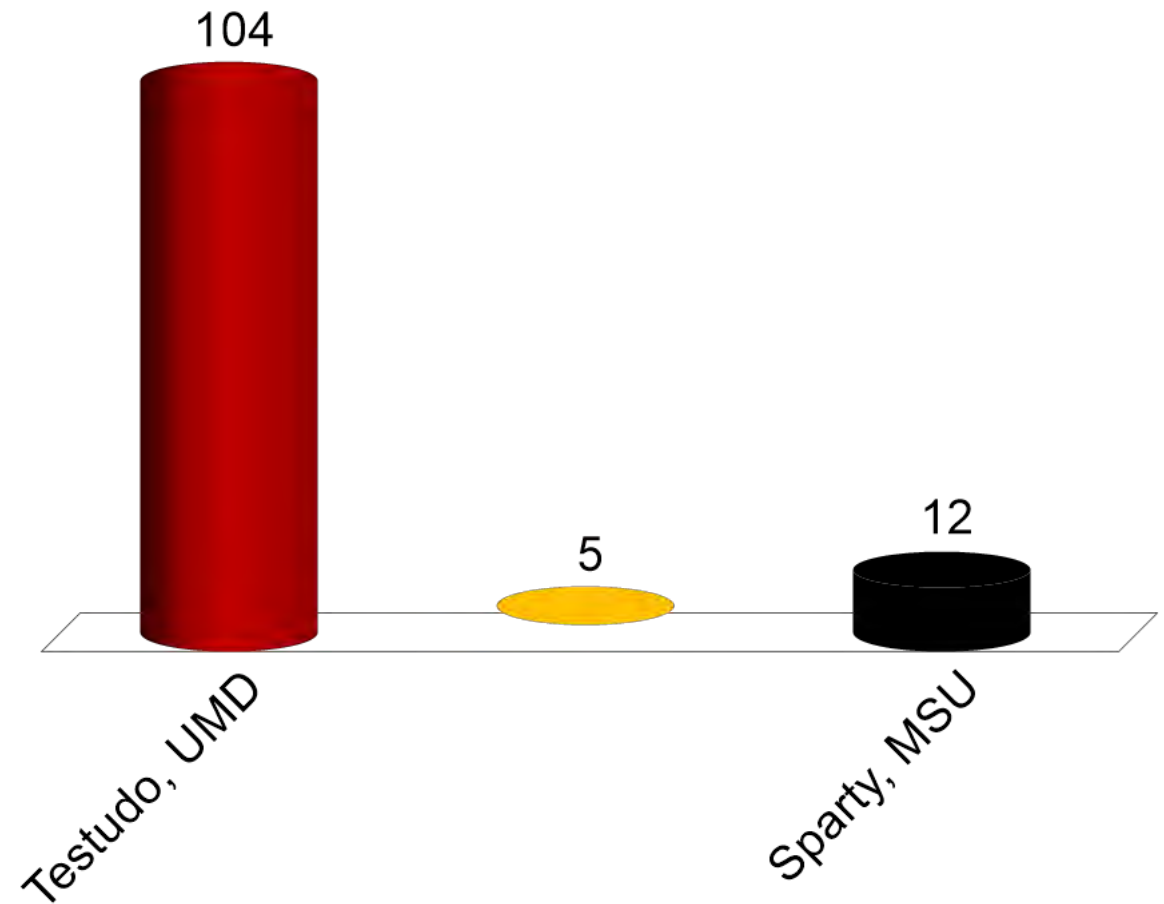

Transition Elections

- Remaining Transition Elections will be held online through Qualtrics with separate elections for each of the major constituencies (faculty, exempt and non-exempt staff, graduate students, and undergraduate students).
- Senate *Bylaws* state that we must allow for nominations from the floor for all of the elections.
- Use the Raise Hand feature to nominate yourself or another Senator when I call for nominations for each committee or council.
- Names of nominees from the floor will be included on the ballots but nominees may not make a statement now or include one on the ballot.



Nominations from the Floor

- Senate Executive Committee (all Senators eligible)
- Committee on Committees (only Senators: faculty, exempt, grad, and undergrad eligible)
- University Athletic Council (only faculty – do not have to be Senators)
- Council of University System Faculty (CUSF) (only faculty – do not have to be Senators)
- Campus Transportation Advisory Committee (CTAC) (faculty, exempt, and undergrad - undergrads must be a Senator but the others do not)



Transition Elections

- Online voting system through Qualtrics has separate elections for each constituency (faculty, exempt and non-exempt staff, graduate students, and undergraduate students) and ballots for only the seats open in that constituency.
- Senators will receive individual links to their ballots.

Welcome to the 2022-2023 Senate! One of the Senate's first orders of business in a new year is to conduct the elections for the Senate Executive Committee, Committee on Committees, and Senate-elected committees and councils, including the Athletic Council, the Campus Transportation Advisory Committee (CTAC), and the Council of University System Faculty (CUSF).



Transition Elections

- Each ballot lists the maximum number of candidates that Senators can vote for on the top, the names of the candidates and their unit, and if you click on the names, their statements.
- Simply check the boxes next to the candidates that you wish to vote for on each ballot.
