



Go/No Go Assessments


- Critical evaluation of key technical metrics (e.g., payroll testing), readiness of business units, and plans for cutover (from PHR/KFS to Workday).
- Go/No-Go Checklist covers eight categories and 324 items.
- Decision process:

Elevate team → **ESC** → **Sponsors** → **President Pines**





Elevate Program Timeline - Phase I



Recent Checkpoint, late March – goal for decision to be made *prior* to training.



Achievements

- The Elevate program has engaged over 400 staff from across our campuses to fully configure Workday for our HR and Finance needs.
- By mid-April the Elevate team will complete all training and support material that will be used to prepare staff, faculty, and students to use Workday.
- 183 staff from across all colleges, divisions, and campuses have had access to a fully operational Workday readiness tenant.
 - 2,062 hours of user time in the Workday tenant (as of 3/30).
- Recently expanded Workday tenant access to a total of 1,000 staff.



Identified Concerns

Technical requirements for payroll.

- UMD payroll is complex due to variety of roles/positions, pay adjustments and pay distribution by State Central Payroll Bureau (CPB).
- Ongoing testing is being conducted with CPB.
- While significant progress has been made with testing we require additional time to complete and validate with specific payroll cases.

Functional readiness.

• Challenges related to staffing in some units/divisions (e.g., open positions). This creates burdens on staff to prepare for July transition.



Decision

- Delay Go-Live
 - New date to be carefully determined with stakeholder feedback.
 - Fully expect new Go-Live to occur in upcoming academic year.
 - Could be as early as fall semester but new date will not be before mid-October.
 - We will inform campus of new Go-Live date as soon as possible.



Postponing Workday Go-Live Will . . .

- Allow completion of rigorous testing protocols.
 - This will allow us to meet the highest standards for an accurate payroll in Workday.
- Provide more time for staff to learn the Workday system including new business processes.
- Give more time for central offices to make sure they are staffed appropriately.
- Result in smoother and less stressful transition to Workday for staff, faculty and students.





- Standing committee charge: charged with broad oversight of the General Education Program. The committee reviews issues concerning the General Education program requirements, vision, learning outcomes, and balance of courses, and makes recommendations to the Senate and the Associate Provost for Academic Affairs and Dean for Undergraduate Studies. The committee receives an annual report on the status of the program from the Associate Provost for Academic Affairs and Dean for Undergraduate Studies. Finished General Education Report review and discussion with Dean William Cohen in March 2023.


